

How to Respond to Police When They are Intent on Charging You

Here are a series of powerful and thought-provoking questions you can pose to a police officer who is intent on charging you. This may not change the present moment, but may plant a seed for the future.

You can also be creative and script your own powerful phrases. Tap into their patriotism. Using the word 'imagine' is very powerful.

“Imagine where this will be in six months.”

“Imagine how history will judge you.”

“Imagine how disappointed we are with you.”

“Imagine how ashamed you’ll be when you realize you could have been our heroes.”

“Imagine how many will die if you don’t stand up for us.”

“What do you think will happen if this keeps up?”

“What do you think will happen when the mob starts to get ugly?”

“How do you think anything good can come from this?”

“How do you think the public will ever trust you again?”

“How do you think you will ever find redemption, having betrayed your oath?”

“How far are you willing to go before police are burn and blood covers the street?”

“If you don’t stand for your oath, if you don’t stand “on guard for thee” as our anthem proclaims, what do you stand for anymore?”

How to Respond when Confronted by Police at a Check Point

No matter how much you want to react, be prepared by having a script you can read.

Take a deep breath and calm yourself as much as possible.

Be conscious of talking in an even manner and more slowly.

Have your phone ready and be prepared to record the interaction.

When the officer asks you where you're going and what you're doing, you are legally obliged to respond.

This information will be scrutinized and will incriminate you.

If you lie and get caught, you will be charged.

If you don't respond, you will be charged.

This can be a no win situation.

Respond to the officer with this statement:

"I'm performing an essential service.

The Charter of Rights and Freedom allows me free movement within my country without being hindered as well as the right to free speech.

I'm now going to use my Charter Right and I choose not to say anything else."

DO NOT SAY ANYTHING ELSE IN RESPONSE TO THIS QUESTION!

The officer is going to want more. They may not like your answer, but you have given an answer. IF you feel pressured in some way to respond, use this script:

"I have answered your question. Do you want me to repeat it?" I will repeat it . . .

I'm performing an essential service!

If the officer ask for ID, gauge the potential outcome. If they are friendly, be friendly back. Give positive feedback. If you believe it will be confrontational, say to them, "I'll gladly give you mine, but I want to know who I'm dealing with first. I want to know that I'm dealing with a real police officer."

They should wear a name tag on their person. Some are removing them. **THEY HAVE TO SHOW ID.**

Ask for a "warrant card" and a badge number to see the name and photo ID.

DO NOT WORRY ABOUT GETTING A TICKET/BEING CHARGED!

THESE TICKETS ARE BEING THROWN OUT OF COURT!

THEY ARE UNLAWFUL AND ILLEGAL!
